The Vietnam Traveling Memorial Wall

The Vietnam Traveling Memorial Wall®, a large-scale replica of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial in Washington, DC, will make a rare Delaware Valley visit in when it visits Pennel in Bucks County, from July 12-17, 2017.

The wall, a 3/5 scale replica of the permanent memorial in Washington, DC, will arrive via convoy on July 12 and will be open for visitation and remembrances July 14-16. The wall will be on display at the Pennel Memorial Ball Field on PFC John Dalola Avenue in Pennel. The tribute is being organized by the Pennel-Hulmeville Memorial Day Parade, Inc., a 501(c)(3) group, in conjunction with the 50th anniversary of the Vietnam War.

The Vietnam Traveling Memorial Wall® stands six feet tall at the center, covers almost 300 feet from end to end, and has 58,307 names inscribed on its surface. This Traveling Memorial stands as a reminder of the great sacrifices made during the Vietnam War. It was made for the purpose of helping heal and rekindle friendships and to allow people the opportunity to honor loved ones in their hometown who otherwise may not be able to make the trip to Washington.

This event is expected to draw 10 -15,000 visitors. There will be possible road closer around the rec field - Pennel Wildcats field. Parking will be off site and signs will be posted for parking & transportation. Handicap parking will be at Our Lady of Grace School. The wall will be arriving by caravan on July 12th. A twilight tribute to the 136 men that were killed or missing during the Vietnam war will occur on Saturday evening, July 15th. For more information contact Ed Preston at: 215-750-3634.

Water Meter Replacement The Bucks County Water & Sewer Authority (BCWSA) is replacing broken water meters throughout the borough. If you have received a notice that they missed you, please follow up by calling the number on the notice.

Proper Sump Pump discharging Stop discharging water into our sewers and legally release the water to have it run over pervious ground (non-compacted soil in your yard) outside your home/business.

ACT 537 Plan Update

Act 537 (the Pennsylvania Sewage Facilities Act) requires Hulmeville Borough to develop, implement, and maintain a comprehensive official sewage management plan. In order to meet the DEP required timelines for updating the Act 537 Plan, a series of meetings are planned by the Hulmeville Borough Council and Water Authority to prepare and adopt an up-to-date Plan. The public is welcome to attend the meetings and provide input (meetings are the 4th Monday of each month, 7:00 pm at Borough Hall.
