Teen Suicide by Sarah Omietanski, Hulmeville Borough Jr. Council Person



n this article I would like to discuss teen suicide in our community. Unfortunately, I have had personal experience with teen suicide. One of my brothers' friends, who also lived in our community committed suicide when we were in 9th grade. This year I decided to join a group at Neshaminy high school called Friends Helping Friends which focuses its efforts on preventing teen suicide and bullying at the high school.

I received information from Bucks County Suicide Prevention Task Force regarding statistics of teen suicide in our community: there is 1 suicide every 12 minutes and 121 suicides every day. In 2016, suicide was the 10th leading cause of death, and in Pennsylvania 1 person dies by suicide every 5 hours. According to National Institute of Mental Health, males are more successful at suicide than females because females are less violent. Ages 10 -34 suicide is the 2nd leading cause of death and guns are used the most to commit suicide. Boys tend to use guns while girls tend to use poison. Depression is the leading cause of suicide because they feel their problems are not going away and believe suicide is a way of solving their problems. Many teens feel they are tired of life or just want a way out. Warning signs of suicide are: feeling sad for more than 2 weeks, out of control behavior, overwhelming fear, mood swings, change in sleep habits and hurting one's self.

The teacher advisor to Friends Helping Friends tells us that when someone commits suicide it doesn't just affect that person but everyone connected to them. Suicide affects their family, their friends and the community that they live in. Don't ignore when someone talks about suicide take it seriously. There are many supports and help is available: Bucks County Children's Crisis Support, National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI), National Suicide Prevention Lifeline and Yellow Ribbon Suicide Prevention Program. If you want to get involved on April 28, 2019 Bucks County Suicide Prevention Task Force will be holding a walk at Bucks County Technical High school. 
Stormwater Management
